Veterans Committee

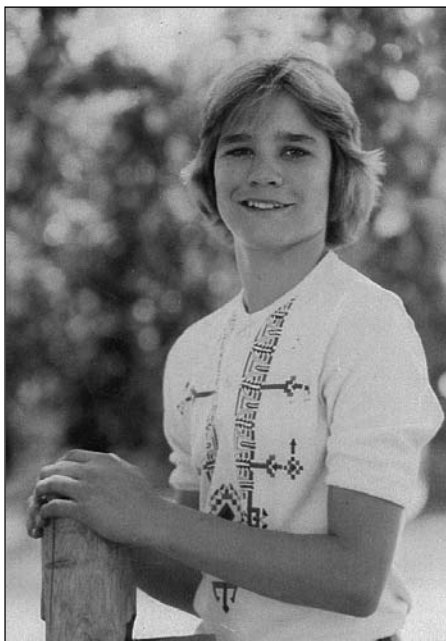
Dear Members,
