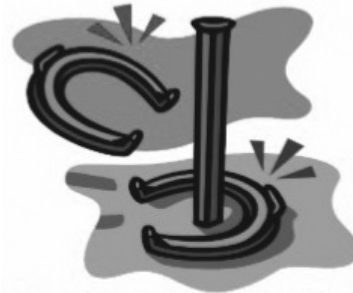

Dear Friend,

I don't think you knew me. I was your neighbor's kid you never really got to know. I was the neighbor who came home some weekends in a Reservist or National Guard uniform. I joined the military, never intending to be a hero; I just wanted to serve my country. Maybe you heard that I was eventually deployed to Iraq, to Afghanistan, one of those countries where it's hard to tell the folks who hate America from those who cherish the freedom we've helped to bring. Anyway, as you might have heard, I never made it home.

I never thought my life would end in a foreign land, never thought I'd be called a "Fallen Hero." I just wanted to finish school. I wanted to raise a family. I wanted to see my son graduate. I wanted to be at my daughter's wedding. But I traded those tomorrows proudly because I felt my being there, protecting the freedoms of those who can't do it on their own, was important.

Can I ask you a favor? On **Sunday, September 28<sup>th</sup>**, some of those who still wear the uniform are going to be running through town and they'll stop at a "Hero Marker" with my name on it. Could you spare 45 minutes to be there? I would hate for my family to be there all alone.

Thanks.

I'm organizing the South Central District mile markers. It will take approximately 1 hour out of your day. The markers are from Deal to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial by PNC Art Center. In our district, we have 38 mile markers, the start time is about 12 pm and the last time is 4 pm. I would like to have as many elks as possible to stand with the family members that have lost someone. If you are interested, please contact me so I can start assigning members to the markers. # NEW JERSEY RUN FOR THE FALLEN TO HONOR STATE'S MILITARY HEROES

**E**ach year, on the last weekend of September, a unique and tremendously moving event is held to remember and honor every

New Jersey military service member who has served and died during the recent conflicts in Beirut, Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm in the Gulf War, Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan, Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation New Dawn in Iraq, Operation Restore Hope in Somalia, and the Pentagon 9/11 Terrorist Attack. The event is organized through the herculean efforts of New Jersey Run for the Fallen (NJRFTF), a completely non-political, non-profit volunteer organization of runners and support crew whose mission is clear and simple: To run one mile for each and every New Jersey service member killed in service to their country in order to pay homage to each life and to their family members and loved ones.

On its website, the organization states, "Although we visibly run one mile to honor and remember each fallen hero from the current conflicts,

the total run represents every service member from New Jersey who laid down their lives for freedom's cause. Thousands have sacrificed to preserve our way of life, and as you give tribute to a particular hero, please remember others who have given the ultimate sacrifice throughout history. New Jersey, being rich in the foundation of this country, has given many of her sons and daughters. Regardless of war or conflict, branch of service, or method of death, we ultimately run for them all, honoring their service and sacrifice, and remembering that they each gave up a future so that we could have ours. We give tribute to them by name wherever possible and to the sacrifice of the families they left behind. The last Friday, Saturday, and Sunday of September, we run across New Jersey to raise awareness for the lives of those who fought and died, to rejuvenate their memories and keep their spirits alive, to support organizations that aid the families of those killed, and to aid in the healing process for the native New Jersey residents whose lives have been affected by war and conflict. We refuse any political affiliation or agenda, but simply honor those who have fought, and those who have fallen, under the American flag."

The agenda for the 2014 New Jersey Run for the Fallen kicks off on Thursday, September 25 with a luncheon for Gold Star Families (those who have lost a family member in the service), followed by a beautiful Sunset Beach Ceremony in Cape May and a Gold Star Family and Run Team Dinner. The Core Run Team is comprised of 24 dedicated active duty military personnel from all across the country and all branches of service who come together, on their own time and at their own expense, to run 186 miles over the course of three days to pay tribute to their fallen comrades and their Gold Star Families. For some, this will be their first year participating; for others, it will mark their return to the roads of New Jersey; for a select few, it will be their sixth year of participation in the grueling run. Traveling ahead of and along with the run team will be several vehicles with New Jersey State Police, medical staff, Blue Star Mothers (those who have a family member serving in the military), and other support volunteers, plus an

Honor Truck and motorcycle escorts by the Warriors Watch Riders, the NAM Knights, and the American Legion Riders.

The run itself – which, unfortunately, has lengthened each year as the names of more fallen heroes have been added to the roster – will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, September 26 at the Cape May Lighthouse, traveling north to finish the day at American Legion Post 524 in Ocean City. On Saturday, September 27, the runners start off at 6:20 a.m. at the Windjammer Diner in Somers Point and will continue to American Legion Post 129 in Toms River that evening. The final and third day, on Sunday, September 28, will begin at 6:45 a.m. at the Brick Elks Lodge and conclude late in the afternoon at the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Holmdel, followed by a closing ceremony. Appropriately, the last Sunday of September is also designated as National Gold Star Mother and Family Day.

Over the years, more and more veterans groups, community and civic organizations, scouts, schools, and others have turned out to cheer on the entourage and pay their respects as they pass by. All along the route, at one-mile intervals, there will a Hero Marker placed at the side of the



road for each fallen military member, with his or her name and the estimated time of arrival of the NJRFTF run team. As the runners arrive at each marker, they stop to salute that hero and to greet any family members and friends who may be gathered there, and present them with an American flag and personal biographical card of their hero. Since the runners' actual time may vary due to road conditions, weather, or other factors, supporters are encouraged to plan on being at each Hero Marker at least 30 to

45 minutes prior to the posted time. Family members, friends, or comrades who wish to run with the Core Team for a particular memorial mile must be capable of keeping pace with the military runners, finishing the mile in 9 ½ minutes. Whoever is running that mile must make their own way to the preceding Hero Marker in time to join in with the team.

Complete information about the New Jersey Run for the Fallen can be found on their website at [www.njrunforthefallen.org](http://www.njrunforthefallen.org) or call (732) 856-8865. The site provides links to the Hero Wall, where the names of every fallen New Jersey service member are listed alphabetically with photos, a bio page, and map of his or her Hero Marker; a route map of the entire run; an order form for NJRFTF t-shirts; details about run team members; photos from past years' events; and much more. Sponsorship and donor information is also available, as the organization is seeking contributions to help offset the cost of event expenses – including overnight accommodations for the Core Run Team and Gold Star Families – and to assist in providing support, hope, and healing to those who grieve the death of a loved one. Sponsors and donors are given recognition on the NJRFTF website, with the names of major sponsors appearing on the run t-shirts. All donors of \$20 or more will receive a 2014 t-shirt and wristband. Additionally, there is information about participating in the "Last 5" Run, where the public is offered the opportunity to run with the Core Run Team of 24 active military runners for the last five miles of the three-day journey as they enter Holmdel Township on their way to the finish at the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans Memorial on September 28.

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
